## PERCEPTIONS OF THE PAST (PP)

\*PP1. The next question concerns how people think about the past. HOWEVER, IF R GIVES A VERY GENERAL RESPONSE LIKE "ADVANCES IN COMPUTING," PROBE: Could you be more specific? ONCE TO SEE IF SOMETHING MORE SPECIFIC IS ADDED (e.g., "THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE WORLD WIDE WEB").
