

Jordi Alonso is a medical doctor, holding a doctoral degree in Public Health, and a specialist in Family and Community Medicine and in Preventive Medicine and Public Health. Dr. Alonso is the director of the Epidemiology and Public Health Program of the IMIM-Hospital del Mar Research Institute in Barcelona, Spain. He is a full professor of Public Health at the Department of Experimental and Life Sciences (DCEXS) of the Pompeu Fabra University (UPF) and an associated professor of Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Dr. Alonso is the director of the Master's Program in Public Health program of Barcelona (UPF-UAB).

His research work has focused on the measurement of Perceived Health and on assessing the need for, and the effectiveness of health services using perceived health outcomes among chronically ill patients, with special interest in mental disorders. Dr. Alonso is the scientific coordinator of the European Study of the Epidemiology of Mental Disorders (ESEMED), a component of the World Mental Health (WMH) Surveys. As a result of his research activity in the last 20 years, Dr. Alonso has published more than 450 scientific publications.

Dr Alonso has participated in many scientific and professional committees. Among others, Dr. Alonso received the Award to Professional Excellence of the College of Physicians of Catalonia in 2005. Dr. Alonso is one of the editors of volume IV of the WMH series edited by Cambridge University Press, entitled: *The Burdens of Mental Disorders*.
